PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 62019 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Robert F. and Arline C. Eveland of 5720 Nonpariel Road, Sutherlin, Oregon 97479, phone 459-5067, for the use of the waters of Calapooya Creek, a tributary of Umpqua River, for the PURPOSE of Irrigation; that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 31, 1981, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.04 cubic foot per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1,350 feet North and 1,440 feet East from the W 1/4 Corner of Section 32, being within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 32, Township 24 South, Range 3 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 24 South Range 3 West, WM Section 32 NE 1/4 NW 1/4 3.5 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed two and one-half acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 17, 1983 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1983.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1984.
