PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 63318 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Unified Sewerage Agency of Washington County of 150 North First Avenue, Hillsboro, Oregon 97123, phone 648-8621, for the use of the waters of Hillsboro West Wastewater Treatment Plant wastewater and effluent holding pond to be constructed under Application R-63317, Permit R-8396, for the PURPOSE of irrigation; that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from February 23, 1982, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1.88 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Diversion 1 (Treatment Plant) - 2,950 feet North and 370 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 6, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 6; Diversion 2 (Irrigation Pump Station) - 200 feet South and 740 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 6, being within the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 7; Diversion 3 (Effluent Holding Pond) - 2,040 feet South and 1,800 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 6, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 7, all within Township 1 South, Range 2 West, WM, in the County of Washington.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 17, 1983 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1985.
