PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 62827 and do hereby grant the same TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to George V. Humphreys of PO Box 507, Cenyonville, Oregon 97417, phone 825-3312, for the use of the waters of South Umpqua River, a tributary of Umpqua River, for the PURPOSE of irrigation; that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 23, 1981, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.29 cubic foot per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1,620 feet North and 950 feet West from the S1/4 Corner of Section 8, being within the NE1/4 SW1/4 of Section 8, Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 30 South Range 4 West, WM Section 8 SE 1/4 SW 1/4 20.0 acres Section 17 NE 1/4 NW 1/4 3.2 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 19, 1983 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October I, 1985.
