PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 58142 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Sidney T. and Pauline A. Gobel of Route 1, Box 32, Banks, Oregon 97106, phone 324-7252, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream with any deficiency in the supply of water to be made up by diversion from Bledsoe Creek and reservoir constructed under Application R-58141, Permit R-8482, tributaries of East Fork Diary Creek, for the PURPOSE of wildlife attraction; that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from December 4, 1978, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.10 cubic foot per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1,685 feet South and 3,155 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 4, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 4, Township 1 North, Range 3 West, WM, in the County of Washington.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township I North Range 3 West, WM Section 4 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 Waterfowl attraction

SW 1/4 NE 1/4 NE 1/4 NW 1/4 SE 1/4 NW 1/4

The appropriation of water under the right allowed herein for waterfowl attraction shall be limited to the period from October I to January 31 of each year and shall be subordinate and inferior to all future rights for beneficial consumptive use.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 29, 1983 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1985.
