PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64135 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to John and/or Gail Garrido of 1114 North Nevada Street, Carson City, Nevada 89701, phone (702)883-0414, for the use of the waters of Harris Gulch when available, with any deficiency in supply from Harris Gulch to be made up by appropriation of water from Frenchman Creek, provided the total quantity diverted from both sources shall not exceed 0.08 cubic foot of water per second, a for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family and irrigation, being 0.005 cfs for domestic use and 0.075 cfs for irrigation; that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 9, 1982, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.08 cfs measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINTS OF DIVERSION are to be LOCATED: Harris Gulch - 775 feet South and 280 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 10, being within the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 10, and Frenchman Creek - 415 feet North and 250 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 10, being within the SW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 10, both being within Township 34 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Jackson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 34 South Range 4 West, WM Section 15 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Domestic use for one family and 6.0 acres irrigation

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 23, 1983 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1985.
