## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64257 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Bruce A. Scott of Route 3, Box 3812, Hermiston, Oregon 97838, phone 567-2051 or 774-7808, for the use of the waters of Hat Rock Drain, a tributery of Columbia River, for the PURPOSE of irrigations that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 9, 1982, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 280 callons per minute measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 2,170 feet North and 10 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 22, being within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 22, Township 5 North, Range 29 East, WM, in the County of Umatilla.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenent, is as follows:

Township 5 Morth Range 29 East, WM Section 22 NE 1/4 SW 1/4 17.0 acres NW 1/4 SW 1/4 8.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable mutation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 23, 1983 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1985.
