PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 63223 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to George R. Humbert, Jr. of 2220 Pettit Lane, North Bend, Oregon 97459, phone 267-7388, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream, a tributary of Willanch Slough, for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family, irrigation, and operation of a hydraulic ram; being 0.005 cubic foot per second of water for domestic use for one family, 0.01 ofs for irrigation, and 0.018 ofs for operation of a hydraulic ram; that the PRIORITY OF THE cfs for irrigation, and 0.018 cfs for operation of a hydraulic ram; that the PRIORITY OF RIGHT dates from January 21, 1982 for 0.013 cfs and November 12, 1982 for 0.02 cfs, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.033 cfs measured at the points of diversion from the stream, or their equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The PCINTS OF DIVERSION are to be LOCATED: Diversion 1 - 330 feet South and 280 feet West; Diversion 2 - 270 feet South and 300 feet West; both from the Northeast Corner of SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 13, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 13, Township 25 South, Range 13 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 25 South Range 13 West, WM Section 13 SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Domestic use for one family and 1.0 acre irrigation

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 7, 1984 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1985.
