PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 63253 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Thomas and Dorothy Craig of Route I, Summerville, Oregon 97876, phone 534-5371, for the use of the waters of a developed spring, a tributary of Mill Creek, for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden; that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from February 11, 1982, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 2,490 feet South and 1,980 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 26, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 26, Township 1 North, Range 38 East, WM, in the County of Union.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township I North Range 38 East, WM Section 26 SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Domestic use for one

Domestic use for one family including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 7, 1984 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1985.
