PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64514 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Willamette Industries, Inc., Albany Paper Mill of PO Box 339, Albany, Oregon 97321, phone 926-2281, for the use of the waters of Willemette River, for the PURPOSE of manufacturing of pulp and paper products; that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 29, 1982, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 12.0 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: South 61 degrees, 54 minutes West, a distance of 3,934.3 feet from the Southeast Corner of the Issac Miller, Sr. DLC 46, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 32, Township 10 South, Range 3 West, WM, in the County of Linn.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 10 South Range 3 West, WM Section 28 NW 1/4 SE 1/4 Industrial manufacturing use

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 7, 1984 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984. Extended to October 1, 1982

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1985. Fixtended to October 1, 1992 1985. Extended to October 1, 1988
