PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 58003 and do hereby grant the same TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW SUBJECT POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Richard G. Lemery and Susan J. Lemery of McKinley Route, Box 768, Myrtle Point, Oregon 97458, phone 572-3353, for the use of the waters of Middle Creek, a tributary of North Fork Coquille River, for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family; that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 17, 1978, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.005 cubic foot per second measured at the point of diversion from the stream, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 250 feet North and 120 feet East from the W 1/4 Corner of Section 33, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 33, Township 27 South, Range 11 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 27 South Range II West, WM Section 33 SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Domestic use for one family

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 14, 1984 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1985.
