### PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64524 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Jon Bowerman of General Delivery, Clarno Route, Fossil, Oregon 97830, phone 489-3367, for the use of the waters of John Day River and Springs 1 and 2; being 0.5 cubic foot per second of water from John Day River for irrigation and 0.01 cfs from Spring 2 with any deficiency in the supply of water available from Spring 2 to be made up by appropriation of water from Spring 1, tributaries of Columbia River, for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre ~~and~~ and noncommercial garden and irrigation; being 0.01 cubic foot per second of water for domestic use and 0.50 cfs for irrigation; that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from November 4, 1982, and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.51 cfs measured at the points of diversion from the stream, or their equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The POINTS OF DIVERSION are to be LOCATED: Diversion 1 (John Day River) - 1,250 feet South and 650 feet West from the E 1/4 Corner of Section 22, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 22; Diversion 2 (John Day River) - 420 feet North and 2,200 feet West from the E 1/4 Corner of Section 22, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 22; Diversion 3 (Spring 2) - 50 feet South and 120 feet West from the E 1/4 Corner of Section 22, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 22; Diversion 4 (Spring 1) - 1,260 feet North and 100 feet West from the E 1/4 Corner of Section 22, being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 22, all being within Township 8 South, Range 19 East, WM, in the County of Wheeler.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

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Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 14, 1984 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1985.
