## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION

and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Laurie Holsinger of 42240 Holden Creek Lane, Springfield, Oregon 97477, phone 896-3878, for the use of the waters of McKenzie River,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from February 22, 1982,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.025 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1,800 feet South and 1,200 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 16, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 16, Township 17 South, Range 1 East, WM, in the County of Lane.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 17 South, Range I East, WM Section 16 SW 1/4 NW 1/4 2.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 14, 1984 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 85
