PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 63721 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Malcolm J. and Eleanor S. Montague of 3960 SW Wapato Avenue, Portland, Oregon 97201, phone 223-0377, for the use of the waters of a spring and an unnamed stream,

for the PURPOSE of domestic supplies for three families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden per family, being 0.005 cubic foot per second of water from the spring for drinking water and 0.02 cfs from the unnamed stream for sanitary* that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 1, 1982,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.025 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Diversion 1 (Spring) - 200.25 feet South and 44.23 feet East from the Guarter Corner common to Sections 14 and 23, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 23; Diversion 2 (Stream) - 195 feet South and 189 feet West from the Guarter Corner common to Sections 14 and 23, being within NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 23, both within Township 6 South, Range 11 West, WM, in the County of Lincoln.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 6 South, Range 11 West, WM Section 23 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 Domestic use for three families including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

*facilities and irrigation,

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 14, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 85 .
