PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC

64182 This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 6418Z and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Donald J. and Carol A. DeFranco for US Deschutes National Forest of 4331 SW Twombly Avenue, Portland, Oregon 97201, phone 244-6364, for the use of the waters of Metolius River, a tributary of Deschutes River,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 28, 1982,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1,825 feet South and 1,100 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 3, being within SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 3, Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM, in the County of Jefferson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM

Section 3 SE 1/4

NE 1/4 Irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/60 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 14, 1984 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 84 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 85 .
