## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64537 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Calvin W. Graham and Emily Graham of Route 1, Box 101C, Days Creek, Oregon 97429, phone 825-3639, for the use of the waters of a spring, a tributary of Corn Creek,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from November 15, 1982,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1,600 feet South and 850 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 26, being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 26, Township 30 South, Range 3 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 30 South, Range 3 West, WM Section 26 SE 1/4 NE 1/4

Domestic use for one family including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 23, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 84.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 85 . Extended to October 1987
