PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **64552** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Ronald D. Quigley of Route 1, Western Heights, Baker, Oregon 97814, phone 523-6825, for the use of the waters of an unnamed spring, a tributary of Quigley Creek.**

for the PURPOSE of **domestic use for 19 families including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden each,**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **November 24, 1982**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.02 cubic foot per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **1,215 feet South and 2,315 feet East from the W 1/4 Corner of Section 13, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 13, Township 9 South, Range 39 East, WM, in the County of Baker.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19**85**. Extended to October 1, 1988. Extended to October 1, 1992, 10-1-97
