PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 63514 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Alfred J. Peirish, Jr. and Marsha L. Peirish of Route 2, Box 414, McMinnville, Oregon 97128, phone 472-1534, for the use of the waters of Baker Creek, a tributary of Yamhili River,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from May 5, 1982,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.05 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 750 feet South and 1,500 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 15, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 15, Township 4 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Yamhill.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 4 South, Range 5 West, WM Section 15 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 2.9 acres NE 1/4 NE 1/4 1.1 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before

March 14, 1984
reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19
