PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 63517 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to L. Robert and Martha Hutchins for the US Deschutes National Forest, of 2014 King Way, Woodburn, Oregon 97071, phone 981-8552, for the use of the waters of Metolius

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from January 28, 1983.

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 2,150 feet North and 860 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 15, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 15, Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM, in the County of Jefferson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM

Section 15 NE 1/4 SE 1/4

Domestic use for one family including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden
