PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64598 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Gebhard Orchards by Edwin W. and/or Franklin H. Gebhard of 446 Beebe Road, Central Point, Oregon 97502, phone 664-1841, for the use of the waters of Gebhard Reservoir to be constructed under Application R-64597, Permit R-8594, for the PURPOSE of temperature control,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from December 27, 1982,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 6.1 acre-feet stored water only.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED. 110 feet North and 185 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 35, being within the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 35, Township 36 South, Range 2 West, WM, in the County of Jackson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 36 South, Range 2 West, WM
Township 37 South, Range 2 West, WM
Section 35 SE 1/4 SE 1/4 9.0 acres
Section 1 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 0.5 acre
Section 2 NE 1/4 NE 1/4 12.5 acres

The permittee shall record and submit annually to the Water Resources Department all pertinent data pertaining to use of water for temperature control (frost protection) on forms furnished.
