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## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION

and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

John Shafer of PO Box 846, Mehama, Oregon 97384, phone 859-2206, for the time of the waters of an unnamed creek, a tributary of North Santiam River,

for the PURPOSE of JO05 cfs for livestock, being 0.125 cubic foot per second of water for irrigation and 0.005 cfs for livestock,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from January 3, 1983,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed seconds.

1,340 feet North and 1,590 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 7, being within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 7, Township 9 South, Range 2 East, WM, in the County of Marion.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 9 South, Range 2 East, WM Section 7 NW 1/4 SE 1/4 5.0 acres and livestock SW 1/4 SE 1/4 5.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19  $^{85}$  .
