PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64560 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

irrigation, for the PURPOSE of

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from December 1, 1982 for 0.01 cubic foot per second and December 23, 1982 for 0.02 cfs,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 6.03 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 4,200 feet North and 3,180 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 5, being within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 5, Township 40 South, Range 8 West, WM, in the County of Josephine.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 40 South, Range 8 West, WM Section 5 NE 1/4 NW 1/4 1.5 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to 1/50 of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
