64768 This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64768 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following

This permit is issued to Gerry B. and Marilyn C. Cameron for the US Deschutes National Forest of 3125 SW Doschdale Drive, Portland, Oregon 97201, phone 246-9594, for the use of the waters of Metolius River,

domestic use for one family including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre for the PURPOSE of lawn and noncommercial garden,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from January 18, 1983 for 0.003 cubic foot per second and February 3, 1983 for 0.007 cfs,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 160 feet South and 1,854 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 15, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 15, Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM, in the County of Jefferson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Section 15 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 Domestic use for one

family including irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden
