PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64820 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to 97601, phone 533-2578, for the use of the waters of Sprague River, a tributary of Williamson River,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation,

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from February 1, 1983,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED. North 3 degrees, 45 minutes West, a distance of 325 feet from the Southeast Corner of Section 12, being within Lot 32 (SE 1/4 SE 1/4), Section 12, Township 36 South, Range 10 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 36 South, Range 10 East, WM Section 12 Lot 25 SE 1/4 SE 1/4 16.6 acres Lot 26 SW 1/4 12.9 acres SE 1/4 SW 1/4 Lot 31 SE 1/4 20.0 acres SE 1/4 SE 1/4 18.2 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before 85 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86
