PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 61929 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Deloyd Kerton Cook of PO Box 14, Frightwood, Oregon 97011, phone 622-3121, for the use of the waters of a spring, tributary of Salmon River.

for the PURPOSE of domestic supplies for nine families (one housesite and 8 mobile homesites) and related domestic uses at 15-unit motel, 7 trailer spaces, 7 RV spaces, and fire station

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 20, 1981

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.03 cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 690 feet South and 1,610 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 26, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 26, Township 2 South, Range 6 East, W.M., in the County of Clackamas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 29, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1986.
