## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64902 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Dan Robert Matthews of Coos River Route, Box 593, Coos Bay, Oregon 97420, phone 269-1652, for the use of the waters an unnamed spring, tributary of East Fork Millicoma River, with any deficiency in the supply of water available from the spring to be \* for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including not to exceed one-half acre noncommercial lawn and garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from February 28, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed ool cubic foot per second.

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 500 feet North and 200 feet East from the Southeast Corner of NE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 25; spring to be supplemented by a pump in Glen Creek - 400 feet North and 400 feet West from the Southeast Corner of NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 25; being within: Spring - NW 1/4 SE 1/4; Glen Creek - NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 25, Township 24 South, Range 11 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

\*made up by diversion from Glen Creek.

Township 24 South, Range 11 West, WM Section 25 NE 1/4 SW 1/4

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 29, 1984 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19
