PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64329 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Donald M. Matson of 1573 North 19th Street, Coos Bay, Oregon 97420, phone 276-4274, for the use of the waters of two springs, tributaries of Catching Slough.

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family and irrigation; being 0.005 cfs from Spring 2 with any deficiency in the available supply from Spring 2 to be made up by diversion from Spring 1 for domestic use; 0.025 cfs from Spring 1 for irrigation and 0.0125 cfs from Spring 2 for irrigation; that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 1, 1982 for 0.013 cfs and January 12, 1983 for 0.0295 cfs

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.0425 cfs, being 0.022 cfs from Spring 1 and 0.0175 cfs from Spring 2,

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Spring 1 - 390 feet South and 945 feet East; Spring 2 - 290 feet South and 900 feet East both from the Northwest Corner of Section 17, being within the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 17, Township 26 South, Range 12 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 26 South, Range 12 West, WM Section 17 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Spring 1 2.0 acres irrigation

NW 1/4 NW 1/4 1.0 acre and domestic use with any deficiency in the supply of water for domestic to be made up by diversion from Spring 1

Actual construction work shall begin on or before reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19
