PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64555 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Steve Illingworth of 1340 Crooks Creek Road, Selma, Oregon 97538, phone 597-2635, for the use of the waters of two springs and a reservoir, tributary of Crooks Creek, to be constructed under Application R-64554, Permit R-8606; being 0.005 cubic foot per second * for the PURPOSE of maintenance of reservoir for wildlife conservation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from November 26, 1982

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Spring 1 - 1,429 feet South and 630 feet East from the N 1/4 Corner of Section 4, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 4; Spring 2 - 1,265 feet South and 680 feet East from the N 1/4 Corner of Section 4; Reservoir - 1,260 feet South and 1,000 feet East from the N 1/4 Corner of Section 4, both being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 4, Township 38 South, Range 7 West, WM, in the County of Josephine.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* from each spring.

Township 38 South, Range 7 West, WM Section 4 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 reservoir maintenance and wildlife conservation

Actual construction work shall begin on or before $\frac{hay}{11,1984}$, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86.
