## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64963 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Roy L. Jones of PO Box 563, Tillamook, Oregon 97141, phone 842-8029, for the use of the waters of an unnamed creek, tributary of Beaver Creek

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for two families and irrigation, being 0.01 cubic foot per second of water for domestic and 0.02 cfs for irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from March 29, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.03 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 40 feet South and 30 feet East from the Northwest Corner of the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 18, being within the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 18, Township 3 South, Range 9 West, WM, in the County of Tillamook.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows: Township 3 South, Range 9 West, WM Section 18 SW 1/4 SE 1/4 3.0 acres and domestic

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 11, 1984 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1986
