PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **64970** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Jane E. Meadows of PO Box 489, Sisters, Oregon 97759, phone 549-9701, for the use of the waters of John Day River, tributary of Columbia River**

for the PURPOSE of **irrigation**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **March 31, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.68 cubic foot per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **1770 feet South and 910 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 36, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 36, Township 8 South, Range 19 East, WM, in the County of Wheeler.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 8 South, Range 19 East, WM	Section 36	NW 1/4	NW 1/4	21.0 acres
		SW 1/4	NW 1/4	6.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **May 31, 1984**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **85**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **86**.
