PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65000 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to William H. and Martha A. Goodman of Route 1, Box 415A, Amity, Oregon 97101, phone 835-5565, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream and reservoir constructed under Permit R-1415, tributary of Yamhili River for the PURPOSE of irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 8, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 2200 feet North and 770 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 11, being within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 11, Township 5 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Yamhill.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 5 South, Range 4 West, WM Section 10 NE 1/4 SE 1/4 12.0 acres Section 11 NW 1/4 SW 1/4 8.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, from direct flow and storage from reservoir constructed under Permit R-1415 and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before $\frac{1}{2}$ $\frac{1984}{85}$, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
