PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 58162 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Pierre and Elizabeth Jones, of Star Route West, Mt. Vernon, Oregon 97865, phone 932-4488, for the use of the waters of (Beech Creek) and John Day River, ~~traverse~~ Columbia River

for the PURPOSE of irrigation, being 5.0 cfs from John Day River and 4.9 cfs from Beech Creek for the irrigation of 395.6 acres during the established season of each year and 7.0 cfs from Beech Creek for the irrigation of 556.4 acres outside of the irrigation season each year during periods * that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from December 8, 1978

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 9.9 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Diversion 1 (John Day River) - 520 feet South and 2,080 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 25, being within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 25; Diversion 2 (Beech Creek) - South 31 degrees West 2,244 feet from Common Corner of Sections 15, 16, 20, and 21, being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 21, both being within Township 13 South, Range 30 East, WM, in the County of Grant.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

- * from October 1 to November 10 and from February 10 to March 31.

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Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 13, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985. Extended to October 1, 1988 Extended to October 1, 1990

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1986. Extended to October 1, 1988 Extended to October 1, 1990

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 5.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 1.5 acre-feet per acre irrigated during the period from October 1 to March 31, provided further that the right allowed herein shall not exceed 5.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated in any one year, provided further that the permittee shall record and submit annually a report of all water used for irrigation during the period October 1 through March 31 of each year on forms furnished.

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
