## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **64733** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Ronny O. Haga of Route 1, Box 2095, Bandon, Oregon 97411, phone 347-2295,** for the use of the waters of **Johnson Creek**

for the PURPOSE of **temperature control and flood harvesting of cranberries, being 0.195 cubic foot per second for temperature control and 0.28 cfs for flood harvesting, provided the total diverted shall not exceed 0.28 cfs**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **January 13, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.28 cfs**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **1630 feet South and 110 feet East from the Northwest Corner of SW 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 4, being within the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 9, Township 29 South, Range 14 West, WM, in the County of Coos.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

The permittee shall record and submit annually to the Water Resources Department all pertinent data pertaining to use of water for temperature control on forms furnished.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **June 13, 1984**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **85**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **86**.
