PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64776 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to James W. Smith of 2005 Murphy Creek, Grants Pass, Oregon 97526, phone 862+2486, for the use of the waters of an unnamed stream with any deficiency in the available supply of water from the unnamed stream to be made up by diversion from Murphy Creek and * for the PURPOSE of fish culture

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from January 21, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed second cubic foot per

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: (1) = 760 feet South and 820 feet West from the N 1/4 Corner of Section 2 (unnamed stream), NW 1/4 NE 1/4; (2) = 1125 feet South and 850 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 2 (Murphy Creek), NE 1/4 NE 1/4; (3) = 1050 feet South and 870 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 2, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 2, Township 38 South, Range 6 West, WM, in the County of Josephine.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* reservoir to be constructed under Application R-64775, Permit R-8653, tributaries Application River

Township 38 South, Range 6 West, WM Section 2 NE 1/4 NE 1/4 fish culture

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 15, 1984 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86.
