PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65036 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Lee G. Boyd of 1604 Meridian Road, Eagle Point, Oregon 97524, phone 826-2288 or 826-6466, for the use of the waters of South Fork of Little Butte Creek, tributary of Little Butte Creek

for the PURPOSE of irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 22, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.09 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 270 feet South and 1220 feet East from the N 1/4 Corner of Section 10, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 10, Township 37 South, Range 2 East, WM, in the County of Jackson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 37 South, Range 2 East, WM Section 10 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 7.5 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation sesson of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before 3uly 15, 1984 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with

Extended to Oct. 1, 1986

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19

* Extended to October 1987
