## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

65180 This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

Gilbert G. Murray of 1513 Northwest Keasey Street, Roseburg, Oregon 7/4/0, phone 6/2-0173, for the use of the waters of Newton Creek, a tributary of South Umpqua River,

for the PURPOSE of

irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from

June 8, 1983

0.01 cubic foot per and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed

300 feet North and 490 feet West from the SE Corner of The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be OCATED within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 14, Township 27 South, Range 6 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 27 South, Range 6 West, WM Section 14 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 0.4 acre

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.
