PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64950 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Jay K. Zieba of 8444 Takilma Road, Cave Junction, Oregon 97523, phone 592-4476, for the use of the waters of East Fork Illinois River and a reservoir to be constructed under Application R-65185, Permit R-8800, a tributary of Illinois River, for the PURPOSE of irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 12, 1983 for 0.10 cubic foot per second of water and June 9, 1983 for 0.04 cfs

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.14 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1500 feet North and 440 feet East from the SW Corner of Section 26 being within NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 26; Reservoir - 2200 feet South and 1820 feet East from the NW Corner of Section 26, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 26, Township 40 South, Range 8 West, WM, in the County of Josephine.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 40 South, Range 8 West, WM Section 26 SE 1/4 NW 1/4 7.12 acres Irrigation

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre from direct flow and storage from the reservoir to be constructed under Permit R-8800.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 25, 1984 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86.
