PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64990 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Orval J. and Eleanor V. Ekstrom of Route 2, Box 593, Chiloquin, Oregon 97624, for the use of the waters of Sprague River, a tributary of Williamson River,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 6, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 2.03 cubic feet per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 300 feet West and 50 feet North from the SW Corner of the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 33, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 33, Township 35 South, Range 10 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 25, 1984 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
