PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65077 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Karl H. and Helga C. Moll of 16084 South Forsythe Road, Oregon City, Oregon 97045, for the use of the waters of Ives Creek, a tributary of the John Day River, and a reservoir to be constructed under Application R-65076, Permit R-8799, for the PURPOSE of Irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from May 9, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.90 cubic feet per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 8480 feet North and 800 feet West from the SE Corner of Section 25, being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 24, Township 8 South, Range 25 East, WM, in the County of Wheeler.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 8 South, Range 25 East, WM Section 24 NW 1/4 SE 1/4 15.9 acres SW 1/4 SE 1/4 9.4 acres NE 1/4 SW 1/4 SW 1/4 2.7 acres SE 1/4 SW 1/4 8.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre from direct flow and storage from reservoir to be constructed under Permit R-8799.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before August 25, 1984 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
