PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION

64917 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Mathew P. Doherty of Route 2, Box 38, Irrigon, Oregon 97844, for the use of the waters of Umatilla River, a tributary of Columbia River,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from March 11, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: North 76 degrees 45 minutes 56 seconds East 2913.19 feet from the W 1/4 Corner of Section 21, being within the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 21, Township 3 North, Range 29 East, WM, in the County of Umatilla.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 4 North, Range 28 East, WM Section 6 NE 1/4 SE 1/4 10.0 acres NW 1/4 SE 1/4 38.0 acres SW 1/4 SE 1/4 10.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/40 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19
