PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **64924** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Marvin Sams of Route 2, Box 30, Milton-Freewater, Oregon 97862, phone 938-7955, for the use of the waters of Little Walla Walla Ford Branch, a tributary of Walla Walla River,**

for the PURPOSE of **frost protection.**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **March 16, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **1.31 cubic feet per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **1980 feet North and 640 feet West from the E 1/4 Corner of Section 2, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 2, Township 5 North, Range 35 East, WM, in the County of Umatilla.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 6 North, Range 35 East, WM	Section 34	SE 1/4	SW 1/4	7.46 acres	Frost protection
Township 5 North, Range 35 East, WM	Section 3	NE 1/4	NW 1/4	1.25 acres	Frost protection

The permittee shall record and submit annually to the Water Resources Department all pertinent data pertaining to use of water for frost control on forms furnished.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **August 25, 1984**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **85**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **86**.
