PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65568 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to George and Susan Potter of HC52-Box 397, Coos Bay, Oregon 97420, phone 267-2789, for the use of the waters of an unnamed creek (Hummingbird Hill) and a reservoir to be constructed under Application R-65822, Permit R-8804, tributary of the Coos River for the PURPOSE of domestic use for two families including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden for each

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 15, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1050 feet South and 550 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 28, being within the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 28, Township 25 South, Range 12 West, WM, in the County of Coos.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 25 South, Range 12 West, WM Section 28 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Domestic use for two NW 1/4 families including the SW 1/4 irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden for each

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 20, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
