PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65054 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Iseli Nursery, Incorporated of 15241 Southeast Tickle Creek Road, Boring, Oregon 97009, phone 663-3822, for the use of the waters of Tickle Creek, tributary Clackamas River,

for the PURPOSE of container nursery operation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 28, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 5.5 cubic feet per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 600 feet North and 1580 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 8, being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 8, Township 2 South, Range 4 East, WM; in the County of Clackamas.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:
