PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65311 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Earl L. and Esther M. Travis** of **1948 Southeast Nehalem Street, Portland, Oregon, phone 236-8064 or 281-7700**, for the use of the waters of **Metolius River, tributary Deschutes River**, for the PURPOSE of **domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **July 15, 1983**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **0.01 cubic foot per second**

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: **1150 feet South and 1425 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 15, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 15, Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM; in the County of Jefferson.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM Section 15 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 Domestic use including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **October 11, 1984**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **85**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **86**.
