## PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65351 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Kay L. and Lucile N. Kelley for the United States Deschutes National Forest of 380 E. Regis Street, Stayton, Oregon 97383, phone 769-5934, for the use of the waters of Metolius River, tributary Deschutes River,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 25, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 460 feet North and 2091 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 10, being within the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 10, Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM; in the County of Jefferson.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 9 East, WM Section 10 SW 1/4 SE 1/4 domestic use for one family Tract C including the irrigation of Lot 44 not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 11, 1984 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.
