PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65818 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Springfield Country Club of 90545 Marcola Road, Springfield, Oregon 97477, phone 747-2517, for the use of the waters of Mohawk River, tributary McKenzie River,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 1, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.67 cubic foot per second

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: North 85 degrees 37 minutes 54 seconds West 188 feet from the Interior Ell Corner of B. Ramsey DLC 71, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 3, Township 17 South, Range 3 West, WM; in the County of Lane.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 17 South, Range 2 West, WM Section 3 NE 1/4 SW 1/4 11.0 acres SE 1/4 SW 1/4 15.0 acres NW 1/4 SE 1/4 22.0 acres SW 1/4 SE 1/4 6.0 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 11, 1984 reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.
