PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65502 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Richard D. Stricklan of 2690 Pleasant Valley Road, Merlin, Oregon 97532, phone 479-5651, for the use of the waters of Jacks Creek, tributary Jump-off Joe Creek,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from August 3, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.41 cubic foot per second of water

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1587 feet North and 810 feet West from the Center Corner of Section 32, being within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 32, Township 34 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Josephine.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 34 South, Range 5 West, WM Section 31 SE 1/4 NE 1/4 32.6 acres

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 4.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 28, 1984 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
