APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

I, B R West (Name of Applicant) of Roseburg (Postoffice), County of Douglas State of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described public waters of the State of Oregon subject to existing rights:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. The source of the proposed appropriation is Harrison Young Creek (Name of stream)

tributary of North Myrtle Creek (S. Fk. Umpqua river)

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.3 cubic feet per second.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is irrigation (Irrigation, power, mining, manufacturing, domestic supplies, etc.)

4. The point of diversion is located S 25° 50' E 63.6 feet from the section corner common to sections 14, 15, 22 & 23. (Give distance and bearing to section corner)

being within the NW 1/4 of NW 1/4 of Sec. 22, Tp. 29 S (Give smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.)

R. 5 W, W. M., in the county of Douglas (No. E. or W.)

5. The main ditch to be 1/5 miles in length, terminating in the NW 1/4 of NW 1/4 of Sec. 23, Tp. 29 S (Smallest legal subdivision) (No. N. or S.)

R. 5 W, W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map. (No. E. or W.)

6. The name of the ditch, canal or other works is B R West Irrigation System

DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

DIVERSION WORKS—

7. (a) Height of dam 5 feet, length on top 25 feet, length at bottom 20 feet; material to be used and character of construction Timber crib. (Loose rock, concrete, masonry, rock and brush, timber crib, etc., wasteway over or around dam)

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions: If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to one-eightieth of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent, for each acre irrigated, and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right herein granted is limited to the appropriation of water from Harrison Young Creek for irrigation purposes.

The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use and not to exceed 0.31 cubic feet per second, or its equivalent in case of rotation. The priority date of this permit is September 3, 1920.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before September 25, 1921 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before June 1, 1922.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1923.
