PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65149 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Dario A. Scarabosio of 800 Beechen Road, Sunny Valley, Oregon 97497, phone 479-1077, for the use of the waters of Burgess Creek, a tributary of Grave Creek,

for the PURPOSE of domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from May 25, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **G.D1** cubic foot per second of water

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: 1920 feet South and 30 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 13, being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 13, Township 34 South, Range 6 West, WM, in the County of Josephine.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 34 South, Renge 6 West, WM Section 13 SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Domestic use for one family including the irrigation of not to exceed one-half acre lawn and noncommercial garden

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **November 17, 1984**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
