PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 64396 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to United States, Malheur National Forest, 139 Northeast Dayton Street, John Day, Oregon 97845, phone 575-1731, for the use of the waters of two unnamed tributaries to Camp Creek,

for the PURPOSE of stock watering

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from October 4, 1982

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second from each source provided the total quantity diverted from the combined sources shall not exceed 0.015 cfs

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED Unnamed Tributary 1 - 2500 feet North and 700 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 31, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 31; Unnamed Tributary 2 - 1200 feet North and 2100 feet West of the Southeast Corner of Section 32, being within SW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 32, Township 17 South, Range 31 East, WM, in the County of Grant.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 17 South, Range 31 East, WM Section 31 NE 1/4 SE 1/4 stock watering

Section 32 SW 1/4 SE 1/4 stock watering

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 25, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1985.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86.
