PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION 65251 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to East Mud Creek Water Users District of Route 2, Box 257, Milton Freewater, Oregon 97862, phone 558-3636, for the use of the waters of Little Walla Walla River, when available with any deficiency in the available supply from the Little Walla Walla River to be* for the PURPOSE of frost control

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from July 1, 1983

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 5.9 cubic feet per second of water

The POINT OF DIVERSION is to be LOCATED: Fruitdale Ditch (Little Walla Walla River) - 670 feet North and 450 feet West from the E1/4 Corner of Section 27, being within the SE1/4 NE1/4 of Section 27, Township 6 North, Range 35 East, WM; Walla Walla River - 1820 feet South and 1830 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 12, being within the SW1/4 NE1/4 of Section 12, Township 5 North, Range 35 East, WM, in the County of Umatilla.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 6 North, Range 35 East, WM Section 16 SW 1/4 SE 1/4 12.88 acres Section 21 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 10.0 acres NW 1/4 NE 1/4 16.57 acres

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **December 2, 1984**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **85**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 86 .
